The Opportunity

• Purchasing has 1,100 long-term competitively bid blanket contracts for items that departments repeatedly buy.

 About 600 one-time bids are conducted each year. If there is no blanket contract and purchases are small (under \$8,000 each and \$54,000 a year), City departments buy directly from vendors of their choice.

Construction Contracting

Public works construction projects are developed within various departments throughout the City, but the bid process and contract compliance is administered within Purchasing and Contracting (PC). PC advertises all City construction projects, receives and tabulates bids, manages the contract execution process and monitors contracts for compliance, including prevailing wages.

Standard public works

The most common construction contract bidding is open competition with the lowest responsive bid from a responsible bidder, also called design-bid-build. This is used for most of the City's construction projects. The City designs the project and posts plans and specifications for public bid.

Public works projects are advertised in the Seattle Daily Journal of Commerce and online at eBid . See also a list of upcoming City construction projects . or see the Annual Construction Showcase booklet 1) for details about other upcoming projects.

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
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

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

When registering in the OBD, you can indicate your business expertise and status as a women- or minority-owned business (if applicable) and register for the City's Consultant Roster.

City departments may also use the City's Consultant Roster to select a consultant for a project. City departments may use the roster to select companies for projects valued at \$314,000 or less. Depending on the project, the department may use any consultant or may use a solicitation process to select the most qualified.






For all public works projects the City has centralized construction contracting within PC. Our office provides the rules, policies, process, and directions, and manages the bidding and contracting process.

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
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

Seattle's Minimum Wage Ordinance went into effect on April 1, 2015.

The Minimum Wage Ordinance sets wages for employees working within city limits. The minimum wage increases every year on January 1. In 2018, the minimum wage for large and small employers is set forth in the table below:

2020 Minimum Wage

For Large Employers (501 or more employees) Does employer pay toward medical benefits?

No	Yes
\$16.39/hour	\$16.39/hour

For Small Employers (500 or fewer employees) Does employer pay \$2.25/hour toward medical benefits and/or does employee earn \$2.25/hour in tips?

No	Yes
\$15.75/hour	\$13.50/hour

The Minimum Wage Ordinance applies to overtime-eligible employees who work in Seattle. Every year Seattle's Minimum Wage increases on January 1. OLS announces the upcoming year's minimum wage increase by September 30 of each year. For large employers in 2019, the minimum wage will increase to reflect the rate of inflation, based on the Seattle-Tacoma-Bremerton Area Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W). For small employers, the minimum wage increase follows a schedule established by the minimum wage ordinance, as outlined in the multi-year chart.

Public Works - Construction Contract NEWS

The City of Seattle intends to publish the 2020 Construction Standards Edition (Plans & Specifications) on February 28, 2020. These apply whenever any construction is performed in the City of Seattle Right of Way. Hard copies of the 2020 Construction Standards will be available for purchase in March. Starting February 28th it will be available for download in PDF format at: http://www.seattle.gov/utilities/construction-anddevelopment/standard-specs-plans

NEW L&I CERTIFIED PAYROLL REPORTING REQUIREMENTS: In 2019, the Washington State Legislature approved changes to the Prevailing Wage law (RCW 39.12). One of these changes is a requirement for all contractors to submit certified payrolls at least once a month directly to L&l's portal. The effective date for these changes is January 1, 2020 and applies to ongoing and future contracts.

- * The City will continue requiring certified payroll submittal via LCPtracker.
- * LCPtracker will provide a solution for contractors to download certified payroll information in a format accepted by L&I which then can be uploaded directly to L&I's portal. Alternatively, contractors will be able to enter certified payroll information directly to L&l's webpage: https://lni.wa.gov/licensing-permits/public-works-projects/contractors-employers/#required-documents-for-doing-the-work
- * A link to instructions for this new process will be on this page as soon as it becomes available.

COMMUNITY WORKFORCE AGREEMENT (CWA) AND PRIORITY HIRE: The City passed the Priority Hire Ordinance in April 2015 and negotiated a CWA to cover most of our construction contracts estimated to be \$5M or more. When registering in the OBD, you can indicate your business expertise and status as a women- or minority-owned business (if applicable) and register for the City's Consultant Roster.

Consultant Roster

City departments may also use the City's Consultant Roster to select a consultant for a project. City departments may use the roster to select companies for projects valued at \$314,000 or less. Depending on the project, the department may use any consultant or may use a solicitation process to select the most qualified.
